Judgment with Execution

What is an Execution?

An Execution is an enforceable order giving authority for the money to be claimed. Execution enables a judgment given in favour of a party, usually the claimant, to be enforced by that party and therefore gives the Coroner the power to visit the Defendants home or business to:

- Collect the money you are owed or;
- See whether the defendant has goods or land to the value of the money owed to you.

How do I find out if the Defendant has other Judgments?

You can search the Judgments Register, at the Court Office to check if the defendant has any outstanding or previous judgments. You can also search Trust Online (www.trustonline.org.uk) You can also ask the Coroner's office.

Is there a fee to pay?

Yes, there is a fee of £12.00 payable to the Coroner's office, you will need to contact the Coroner's office to find what payment methods they accept as each office has different options.

What happens when I have given the Coroner the Execution?

The Coroner will visit the defendant to collect the money either in full or with agreement with you by instalments. If the Coroner is unable to collect the money by either of the above methods, they will conduct enquiries to ascertain if there are sufficient goods or land to seize and sell by auction.

How long before I get my money?

Unfortunately, there is no simple answer to this question as every case is different, however the Coroner's office will make attempts to recover the debt and will advise you on their success.

The Coroner has had my Judgment and I've not had any money, why?

There can be many reasons why a case can take time such as difficulty in speaking with the defendant, negotiating a settlement, finding sufficient assets or your case may be in a queue with other plaintiffs. You can be assured that the Coroner's office will be making attempts to recover your debt.

Why hasn't the Coroner seized the Defendants car / property and sold it?

The Coroner is restricted by law as to what items can be seized and often high value goods such as cars, TV's etc are on finance and therefore do not belong to the defendant.

What can I expect to get back?

The Coroner will attempt to obtain for you the Execution amount and fees paid, there is also a percentage-based fee added to the amount the defendant has to pay and this is the Coroners commission for recovering your monies.

Is there anything I can do to assist the Coroner?

Yes, please ensure any information you have is passed on even if it doesn't seem important to you. Also, if you have bank details for the defendant please pass them on as it is possible to arrest bank accounts if necessary.

Please remember having an Execution is no guarantee that the Coroner will be able to recover your money!
